Toronto, ON (February 10, 2025): <u>Ripple Foundation</u> – Two student winners of Kids Write 4 Kids - a national creative writing contest run by Ripple Foundation - have delivered the proceeds of book sales to Childhood Cancer Canada, their chosen charity.

The contest winners always donate the proceeds from the book sales to a charity of their choice.

The competition, open to those in grades four to eight, is running again, with this year's deadline being March 31, 2025.

Myah and Alina have produced incredible stories which deal with powerful subjects for Kids Write 4 Kids, and they are now helping pay it forward through their donation.
